Upcoming October program will be Ben Hollingsworth who will show his many Challenge quilts from over the years. The meeting will be at the Goodyear Clubhouse due to voting that day at the Civic Center. In November, Amy Walsh will do a program on fabric dying.

The December meeting will be the Christmas Party on Saturday, December 3, at the Country Club. Cost per member is \$25 and must be paid before the party so that correct number of guests can be turned in ahead of the party.

There were 51 members and 2 guests present.
